29th Sunday in Ordinary Time.

Readings: Isaiah45:1, 4-6; Psalm:96 1 - 10; Thessalonians 1:1-5b,; Gospel Matthew 22:15 - 21

Both Isaiah and our Psalmist extol the power of God. Nations are invited to bring their gifts to God in the temple. Overwhelmed by what God has done he tells others about God's greatness. The one God shows forth glory and strength.

Cyrus was the King of the Medes. He was the most powerful king in that part of the world, his kingdom comprising the lands of both the Assyrians and the Babylonians, and more. In spite of his power and importance, and the fact that he does not believe in God, God can use him to further his plans. He in effect becomes God's anointed king or messiah. Cyrus can do for God what no King of Judah or Israel can do. He can set the Jewish exiles free and facilitate the rebuilding of Jerusalem without asking anything in return. God is more powerful than the greatest earthly king.

In the Gospel of Matthew the Pharisees and the Herodians are attempting to draw Jesus into a conflict between religion and the state. In doing so they are seeking to either politically incriminate Jesus or to personally discredit him. Recognizing their intentions Jesus is able to elude the trap.

The Pharisees as religious people resent paying the Roman taxes that are burdensome to the economy and puts them under a foreign power. Herodians for their part are the administrators of Roman taxation in Palestine. If Jesus comes out against taxation, then he will be reported to Herod Antipas and could be executed as a rebel. If he comes out for taxation then the Jewish people would be against him and he wouldn't be a problem for the Pharisees.

As Jesus asks for a coin he is pointing out their hypocrisy. Why do they have money changers in the temple? It is because foreign currencies weren't allowed because they have images of false gods (i.e. Caesar). The denarius demonstrates that they are part of the Roman economic system. The coin technically belongs to Caesar, his image and title are on it. Jesus is able to bring the argument to a different level. Give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God.

Jesus wants us to recognize our dual citizenship. While we live in the world, but we are also called to live in relationship with God. The political system of the world creates debts, but we have an even greater debt to God who is the source of all we have and are. It is sometimes easy to forget this debt. The tax collector is much more insistent than God who quietly guides us even if, like Cyrus, we are not aware of it. The point is when we give to God what is God's he is able to bestow even greater gifts and we are able to come into an even fuller union with him.

As St. Paul writes to the Thessalonians he is able to rejoice in knowing that God is working in the community. Thessalonica was a large international city, the Roman capital of Macedonia. It was also a thriving seaport. On his first visit Paul had to leave town rather quickly because of threats to his life. Paul was able to send Timothy back to check on the Thessalonians and received a report of an active Christian community.

Paul gives thanks for their active faith. He recognizes them as a people of faith, hope and charity. These of course are the theological virtues that allow us to grow in relationship with God and come to know him ever more fully. The Gospel has taken root, the Thessalonians have become God's chosen people.

God's word is effective because the Holy Spirit is operative in the world. The Holy spirit changes believers. As we pray this weekend pray that the Holy Spirit may continue to change us and that they power of God may be manifest in our own community as we grow in him
