Readings: Proverbs 31:10-13,16-18,20,26,28-31; Psalm 128;1 Thessalonians 5: 1-6; Matthew 25:14-30

Today's theme is about receiving God's gifts (His Grace!) and using it to advance the kingdom. To become participants in God's life. Our first reading introduces us to a capable wife. She is a woman of industry – she works with willing hands. Everything she does brings profit to her family. But not just for her family because she opens her hands to the poor and reaches out to the needy. She speaks with wisdom and kindness. Because of this her works are praised and she receives a share of the fruit of her hands

As this woman works she grows closer to God and to others. In the same way our parable using God's blessings (His Grace) in our own lives.

A man going on a journey summoned three of his slaves and entrusts his property to them -5 talents, 2 talents and 1 talent, to each according to their ability. Then he goes away. The first two men are apparently happy with the situation, they invest their masters property and when he returns they are able to show double for what they were given. By proving themselves to be good and trustworthy slaves they receive promotions and are invited to share the joy of their master.

The third slaves, however, takes what he has been given and buries the talent in the ground – this action reflects the relationship he perceives that he has with his master. It is coloured by dislike, mistrust and ultimately fear. This slave received the wrath of his master. What little he has is taken away from him and given to the one who has ten talents.

At first glance this might seem to be unfair, that the one who has little, what he has is taken away and given to the one who has much. Jesus is talking about the reality of God's grace in our lives. If we don't nurture it, if we don't exercise it – it disappears, but if we are prepared to work with it, it grows.

An important aspect of the parable is the relationship of the slaves with the master. The first two seem to embrace the challenge presented to them, to be able to work with what the master had entrusted to them. You could say that they sought to enter into the master's joy – to have a greater share in his life. The third slave disliked his master and didn't want anything to do with him.

This obviously is a parable of discipleship. How God seeks to share his life with us – he gives us his grace. By working with it we are able to share more fully in his life. It is only through openness to God that we are able to grow closer to him and to come to understand his plan for our happiness (our fulfilment).

As we live in his grace he is able to reveal himself to us and we are able to more fully respond to him. Today St. Paul warns us that the day of the Lord is coming life a thief in the night. When people think that everything is good, is secure, it will come upon us. However, if we are living in his grace we may be called children of the light. We will not 'fall asleep" in the darkness, but be people who are spiritually alert, because we live in Him.

My friends, as Deacon Dan would say, how important it is to exercise our faith that it should not fail in time of trial. To firmly grasp on to the life that Jesus Christ is offering us and to grow into it. That we can enjoy all that Christ wants for us and not take it for granted
