Christ the King: Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

Readings: Ezekiel 34: 11-12, 15-17; Psalm 2;1 Corinthians 15: 20-26, 28; Matthew

25:31-46

As we approach the end of the Church's year our thoughts are drawn to the final things. Classically the four last things are death, judgement, heaven and hell. These are things that we usually put on the back burner. We think that we'll deal with then when they happen, if they happen. But the reality is that they will happen at some time.

In the ups and downs of life I am heartened by the thought that when all is done and finished Jesus Christ is King and the he will share his victory with us.

Judgement is the theme of Ezekiel, St. Paul and Jesus in today's readings. Ezekiel speaks for God as the shepherd who cares for his flock, seeking out the lost, binding us the injured and strengthening the weak. In the end he will judge his flock, between one sheep and another, between rams and goats.

St. Paul doesn't speak directly to judgement, but he notes that Jesus' resurrection leads to salvation. That just as sin came into the world through Adam so all are made alive in Christ. His reign puts all his enemies under his feet even death so that God can be all in all. This subjection of his enemies necessarily leads to judgement.

"When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all his angels with him, then he will sit on the throne of his glory" All the people will be gathered to him and he will separate one from another and he will put them at his right and his left. Those on his right will inherit the kingdom prepared for them while those on his left will be cast into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels.

What is the point that separates these two groups? It is love, the ability to share God's life with others. Not based on receiving a reward, but doing it because it is the right thing to do. Feeding the hungry, giving a drink to the thirsty, welcoming a stranger or clothing the naked, caring for the sick or visiting prisoners are not always easy things to do. Yet it is important for us to do without always seeing Jesus standing beside us. Loving for the sake of loving.

God wants us to share in his love. Through Jesus Christ he draws us to himself that we may have a share in his resurrection. Judgement will not be harsh unless we have first rejected his love.

A friend of mine once said that she was, at times, hard to get along with so that I could exercise my Christianity. As we move through the hardships and disappointments of life we grow in our ability to exercise our life in Christ.
