Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

In the next few days we will celebrate two important Solemnities; the solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God and the Feast of the Holy Family

Mary, the Holy Mother of God is the 8th day of the Christmas Octave (January 1.) Mary always points to Jesus and who he is. In this solemnity we recognize that Jesus was not just a little baby, he is God. The Marian title "Mother of God" was much debated in the early church. Mary was certainly the mother of the child Jesus, but is it right to call her mother of God because God existed before her and created all that is. How can she be his mother. Who is Jesus? He is God and he is the son of Mary. In that Mary conceived (with the help of the Holy Spirit) and gave birth to Jesus, The second person of the holy Trinity. She can properly be called the Mother of God. This issue was settled at the Council of Ephesus in 451 AD. At the heart of the debate was whether you can separate the human and divine natures of Jesus – the answer is you can't.

The title "Mother of God" (Theotokos) is the highest title for Mary and is the basis for every other title and dignity accorded to her. Following the Council of Ephesus Marian devotion spread throughout the Church and Marian feast days have multiplied. Traditionally Mary, the Holy Mother of God is a Holy Day of Obligation.

We celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family December 31st 2023. This feast is traditionally set on the Sunday that falls between Christmas and New Year's – The Solemnity of the Divine Motherhood. It focuses on Jesus humanity and the importance of the family in raising a child. Jesus needed Mary and Joseph as he grew up. He needed their nurturing and protection. Particularly from King Herod, who even though he was dying was prepared to kill the Holy Innocents to protect his grip on political power. He even killed members of his own family.

As we celebrate the Holy Family we pray for our own families and all that they do for us. The love of family is important for our development as human beings. These days we often hear the term "dysfunctional" applied to families. This is unfortunate. After the Holy Family there are probably no perfect families, but our families still function and are centres of love and support.

We can sometimes forget that as in the Holy Family we all have a role to play. The other members of our family need each one of us to play tour part. At times we expect our families to function without us. It is perhaps a good time to recommit ourselves to doing our part in the family.

After Mary and Joseph found Jesus in the temple when he was about twelve years, he went home with them to Nazareth and was obedient to them. Under their guidance he grew and became strong, filled with wisdom and the favour of God was upon him.

I wish you all the best for the New Year and look forward to growing with each of you in our faith.
