1st Sunday in Lent

Readings Genesis 9:8-15; Psalm 25; 1 Peter 3:18-22; Mark 1:12-15

God's Covenant

In Genesis we read about God's concern for his creation. As Noah and his family came out of the ark God makes a covenant with him. Between God, "Noah, his descendants and every living creature that is with you." Never again shall all flesh be cut off by the waters of the flood. Never again will a flood destroy the earth. The rainbow will be the sign of the covenant.

In a sense God's care for his creation is a reiteration of God's blessing on creation and an anticipation of the covenant between God and Israel. The covenants are always initiated and rest entirely with God. The rainbow is a reminder of God's pledge to preserve the world and a sign of God's faithfulness and mercy. God states, "I will remember my covenant."

The psalmist is acutely conscious of sin, of our turning away from God. His sense of fragility leads to prayer. Realizing that we cannot overcome sin by our own strength and ability, but only in God's love and mercy.

As St. Peter reflects on Noah and the ark he sees that 8 persons were saved in the ark bringing them safely through the water. The ark prefigures baptism where through water

we are brought into a saving relationship with God. By his passion Jesus, the righteous one dies for the unrighteous (for us). He is put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the Spirit. "Angels, authorities are made subject to him. Christ's death is life producing and even his suffering has value. Baptism is our spiritual coming to life in the Spirit. In baptism we put off our fleshy sins and live through Jesus' resurrection. He challenges us to accept the conditions of his service, to recognize the privileges and promises made to us and at the same time to accept the responsibilities and demands of following him.

St. Mark's account of the beginning of Jesus' ministry is marked by its brevity. Following his baptism, we are told, that he was driven into the wilderness by the Spirit where he is tempted by Satan. He was with the wild beasts and the angels waited on him. The 40 days reflects the 40 years in the wilderness, a time of preparation. Jesus withstood the test and is ready for his life giving service to God and humanity. We have to struggle against our own tendencies to sin and the rejection of Satan. In our weakness we are called to realize the experiences of temptation and weakness were not unknown to the Son of God. It is through faith that we can experience the victory won by Jesus on the cross.

As John is arrested, Jesus' mission begins. "Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the good news of God and saying the 'The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe on the Good News." Jesus is God's good news in person. The divine breaking into his creation.

The Kingdom of God is a favourite theme of the synoptics and the idea of the kingdom would have been appealing to Jesus listeners, but the good news demands a radical response – to repent and believe. The very power of God is available to those who open themselves to Jesus. Near enough that anyone who chooses can reach out and lay hold of it through faith. The kingdom has both a present and a future quality. Something that can be realized now and something to look forward to.

As we enter the Lenten Season we can perhaps hear the voices of the prophets, 'turn back with all your hearts.' Pope St. Gregory the Great reminds us that what we are called to do in Lent is actually no different than what we are called to do every day. We know, however, that we are often distracted by the world and taken off task. To return to the teaching of Jesus. To make room for him in our day. To reach out and grasp the kingdom that is so near and to share in Jesus' life saving service to God and humanity.
