April 28, 2024

5th Sunday of Easter

Readings: Acts9: 26-31; Psalm 22: 25b - 31; 1John 3:18-24; John 15: 1-8.

The word that stands out to me in today's readings is "abide." To abide is defined as; dwell, remain, last and endure. God is not asking for a superficial commitment on our part, we must be prepared to abide in him. In the first reading Paul appears in Jerusalem as a convert to Christ, ready to do battle for him. He is definitely committed, but he is in need of further pruning by the Father. In the second reading St. John calls on us not just to live in word and speech, but in truth and action. We are opened to truth when we obey God's commandments and abide in him. Finally Jesus identifies himself as the true vine. We can only produce the fruit of the kingdom if we abide in Him and He in us.

In the scenario of the vine we are the branches and God is the vine grower. Israel is often identified as the vineyard. Isaiah points out that, "The vineyard of the Lord of hosts is the house of Israel." As the vine grower God demonstrates personal care for his people as he prunes the fruitful branches that they can bear even more fruit. If we are to bear fruit it is essential that we are firmly united to Jesus and his life giving word. Jesus reminds us that apart from him we can "do" nothing.

But, "If you abide in me, and my words abide in you. Ask whatever you wish and it will be done for you". This is not about a name it and claim it approach to faith, it is not about making glib requests of the Lord. It's about being so close to him that we have a share in

God's life and are able to bear the fruit that glorifies the Father and allows us to be true disciples of Jesus.

For St. John being faithful means obeying God's commands. By obeying the commands we are able to abide in God and do what is pleasing to him. That is believing in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and loving one another. St. John points out that God is greater than our hearts, he who knows everything can certainly expand our ability to share in his life and pattern our lives after that of Christ, uniting ourselves more firmly to him. If our conscience is clear we can come to God without fear and our requests will be heard.

In the Acts of the Apostles Paul appears in Jerusalem ready to proclaim Jesus Christ risen from the dead. The problem is that the community is suspicious of him, given his former persecution of the Church. Fortunately Barnabas is able to explain his conversion on the road to Damascus. Still Paul has problems proclaiming the word. His aggressive witness and arguing were problematic. He was willing and able, but still needed God's pruning before he could be the apostle God was calling him to be. The believers were able to intervene, bringing him to Caesarea and sending him home to Tarsus, where he was able to focus his efforts and to abide in Jesus.

Paul himself witnesses to this in 1 Timothy 1:12-13 where he says, "I am grateful to Jesus Christ our Lord, who has strengthened me, because he judged me faithful and appointed me to his service, even though I was formerly a blasphemer, a persecutor and a man of violence."

Many try to be good and honest people, but if you are not abiding in Jesus, you are missing the special gift he has for you. God is glorified when people come into a right relationship with him and bear much fruit. Our faith is not just important for us, it is important for the world and for a people yet unborn.

"Lord, from you comes my praise in the great congregation. All families and nations shall worship before him" Ps.22
