The 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time:

Deuteronomy 6: 2-6; Psalm 18: 1-2, 3+6b,46+50ab; Hebrews 7:23-28; Mark 12: 28-34.

Our first reading from the Book of Deuteronomy points out that importance of loving God all the days of your life. By keeping his decrees and commandments God gives us long life. In observing them diligently things will go well with us.

"Hear, O Israel

The Lord is your God, the Lord alone. You shall love the Lord your God with your heart and all your soul, and all your might Keep these words that I am commanding today In your hearts.

A devote Jew was to teach this prayer to their children and speak of it at home and abroad, whether you are busy or at rest. Love of God cannot be neglected or overshadowed, it must be central to your being. It is in this way that they could live in the land God had given them, "A land flowing with milk and honey." As was promised them by God himself.

In today's Gospel a scribe approaches Jesus and asks him, "Which commandment is the first of all." This would have been a fairly common question to ask a rabbi. It allows the teacher to show his knowledge of the Law and how it affects his life and the lives of his listeners. Jesus' answer is a prayer from the Book of Deuteronomy expressing total love for God. It's known as the Chema and

was prayed by devote Jews on a daily basis. What is interesting about Jesus' response is that he links so closely with the second commandment, "You shall love your neighbour as yourself."

I think that we can all see the wisdom of loving God. In knowing and loving God we are able to better grasp his creation and live in it with a sense of purpose and gratitude and using it in the way he intended. But loving our neighbor? This is more challenging especially when we're not "feeling the love." By placing these two commandments side by side Jesus is saying that one is the natural extension of the other. We can't truly love God without loving our neighbor. So as we're struggling to love our neighbour to seek God's help, that we may love him more fully, and that by sharing in his love we may reach out to our neighbour

The wisdom of this commandment to love was not lost on his listeners. The critics were hushed and the scribe recognized that Jesus was right. That this commandment to love was much more important than the whole burnt offerings and sacrifices. Jesus saw the scribe answered wisely and said to him, "You are not far from the Kingdom of God."

This episode is different from many found in the Gospel where Jesus is in conflict with the Scribes and the Pharisees. Here Jesus is listened to and his wisdom shared. When we struggle with God's teachings we are harming ourselves. How important it is to be open to God and allow him to draw us to himself and envelope us with his saving love.

To appreciate what God has done for us in Jesus Christ. The author of the Hebrews identifies Jesus as the high priest. Unlike mortal men he doesn't first have to offer sacrifice for his own sins. His sacrifice is himself once for all, that salvation may be open to us. As we pray today take the time to reflect on all that God has done for us and the life he truly holds out to us.
